(Every rational barbershopper knows the bass is the most important harmony part, so this month's creed is for <del>us</del> them.)

- I will always remember that Basses are God's chosen people and will strive to convince others of that truth.
- Whenever the notes fall within my "Power Range," I will sing in a manner that conveys the message "I am a Bass! Hear me roar!"
- 3. Whenever there exists the slightest opportunity for a swipe, I will take it, whether the music is so written or not.
- I will, on rare occasions, allow the Baritone to take a swipe.
- I will always remember that the Bass establishes the sound of the quartet or chorus and I will not allow the Bari, Lead and Tenor to forget it.

- I will remember that the lead carries the melody and message of the song and so, will show him a modest amount of respect. I will not overdo it.
- I will remember that the Tenor, though he sings girlishly, is a rare and hard to find guy and so, will treat him with grudging respect. I will not overdo it.
- I will not step on the Lead's pickups and will tune my voice to his, even though he is prone to drop pitch. For I am a Bass and I can reach it.
- 9. I will frequently remind the Bari that his proper function is to make the Bass sound good.
- I will do all of the above in a spirit of humility befitting one of God's chosen people.

## Grandma's Boys Release New CD Set

The best-known quartet to emerge from North Shore Chapter was a foursome from New Trier East and West High Schools that took Illinois District by storm in 1968 and captivated the barbershop world for years after that, even following their winning the international championship in 1979.

That quartet—Grandma's Boys—consisted of former Shoreliner Chorus directors Jay Giallombardo and Hank Brandt, along with John Miller and Don Barnick—and also Jeff Calhoun, Jim Sikorski, and Randy Loos. They have now released a two-CD set that combines their three LPs, some previously unreleased material, and a full live performance from a barbershop chapter show. Listeners can now thrill again to such classics as "When the Toy Soldiers March on Parade," "You've Gotta Be a Football Hero," "When I Fall in Love," "When I Fall in Love," "I Had a Dream, Dear," and many more.
