Fall Convention Was Fine!

Not many of our members were able to make it to fall district convention in Peoria, but **Bill Remien** and **Phil Martin** enjoyed the weekend of harmony.

In the chorus contest, Lake County's **Great American Chorus** led the pack with a total of 963 points, followed by the **West Towns Chorus** (Chicagoland West Suburban Chapter, formerly Lombard), who garnered 905 points. Other top-five finishers: **Great Plainsmen Chorus** (West Peoria Metro, third place, 894 points); **Sound of Illinois Chorus** (Bloomington #1, fourth place, 893 points); and **Bell Notes Chorus** (Belleville, fifth place, 828 points).

Aces High were crowned quartet champs, with a total of 1788 points. Second place went to **Pinnacle**, who finished with 1733 points).

Alchemy (whose bass is North Shore Chapter member **George Sotos**) made an impressive third-place showing, ending up with 1716 points. Fourth place was **All 4 One** (1677 points), and fifth place went

to **Crosstown Connection** (1654) in their first contest appearance in many years.

Jim Foley added another district senior quartet gold medal to his collection with **Gym Class's** victory in the senior division.

Spring Convention in 2003 will be April 25-27. Since the **Shoreliner Chorus** plans to be among the competitors, we urge all members to reserve that weekend on their calendar NOW.

District HOD (House of Delegate) Actions That Will Affect Us . . .

- The 2003 district directory will be published online and the printed version discontinued. The directory will be accessible via the district Web site (www.harmonize.ws/ILL). This will save the district considerable money.
- Effective with spring convention, Illinois District convention registration will increase to \$35. No word on late fees.
- Fall convention is rescheduled to Aug. 22-24. Please note!



2003 Chapter Officers Elected

It’s The Audiofile, an index to a private collection of more than 12,000 recorded songs – most from the early ’20s to the late ’40s (the golden age of popular song)—and many of them unobtainable from any other source.

Each of these performances is now available to Barbershoppers on cassette or CD (unless protected by copyright, of course).

Access to the database is free for your first look. But after that, we encourage you to make a donation of any size to the Society’s Harmony Foundation. (Well, you had planned to make one anyway, hadn’t you?)

If you see performances you’d like to own, the owner will dub them onto cassette or CD and send them to you at no charge. We ask only for a further donation to Harmony Foundation of \$10 for the first song in a request and \$5 for each additional song.
