Won't You Be Our Singing Valentine?

North Shore Chapter's Singing Valentines program is under way. As in past years, we will operate in tandem with the Arlington Heights Chapter program. We plan to make quartets available to fill orders to sing up to three songs ("I Love You Truly," "Let Me Call You Sweetheart," and "Story of the Rose") at requested times during Saturday, Feb. 9; Sunday, Feb. 10; and Thursday, Feb. 14. In addition to singing, the quartet will present each recipient with a rose and a personalized card. Our pricing for the package will range from \$40 to \$60 depending on how large a window of time the customer chooses.

While checks and cash are the preferred method of payment, we will be able to accept Visa or Mastercard charges this year through Arlington Heights Chapter's account. All we need to provide is the customer's name as it appears on the charge card, the complete card number, the type of card, and the expiration date. Naturally, we will need for all orders to be paid in advance.

Our agreement with the Arlingtones commits us to marketing our program vigorously. To that end, there will be Singing Valentines brochures available at each chapter meeting. We ask all members to help us fulfill

our commitment by taking brochures, posting them, passing them out . . . in short, doing whatever is necessary to reach the greatest number of prospects as soon as possible.

A Free Music Course

If you are one of our readers with Internet access, a free music course with 26 self-taught lessons is just a click away. Set your browser to <http://www.musictheory.halifax.ns.ca/> – when the home page appears, click on “Free Lessons” in the top menu.

This music course was put together by a Canadian barbershopper and music teacher, **Gary Ewer**. You can pursue the music course in the privacy of your own home and at your own pace.

Once you enter the URL (user resource location) in

your browser, bookmark the location (Ctrl+D) or add it to your “Favorites,” so you can easily return to it for the next lesson.

The lessons include such topics as notes, durations, major and minor scales, intervals, time signatures, key identification, triads, triplets, and a number of other subjects. Each lesson has an instruction sheet to study, then you can return to the site to take a quiz on the lesson and also to see the answer sheet.
