Remien Wins Buckley Award

Bill Remien has been chosen by members of North Shore Chapter as the recipient of the Tom Buckley Barbershopper of the Year Award for 2002, in recognition of his many contributions to our chapter in the past year.

A member of North Shore Chapter and of SPEBSQSA since 1975, Bill has served in most chapter offices, chaired numerous committees, and represented us as district delegate. He is the Lead Section Leader, sings lead with the **North Shore Four**, and typifies the barbershop spirit in his readiness to sing in a pickup quartet at any time.

Bill and his wife Marilyn have hosted many chapter social events, not to mention innumerable Board and committee meetings, and both have shown their support for our group in many ways. Whenever he has seen a job that had to be done, Bill has never hesitated to do it or find a willing volunteer to do it.

Bill has not only been a constant booster for chapter involvement, he has also encouraged Shoreliners' participation in district activities, such as conventions and IDAH. We salute our 2002 Barbershopper of the Year: Bill Remien.

Entertainment Sales: It All Adds Up

North Shore members did a good job selling *Entertainment 2003* coupon books, according to Chairman **Pete Brandt**.

To date, we have sold a total of 66 books (compared to 57 sold in 2001-02). This year the books were priced at \$20 each, a savings of \$5 over the previous year's price, but the chapter's rebate per book sold dropped from \$5 to \$4. Our chapter's gross sales so far are \$1,320, and our net profit is \$264. In 2002, net income from \$1,425 in gross sales was \$285. In addition, thanks to the members who made cash contributions in lieu of selling books.

Individuals who still want to sell or buy books to benefit the chapter this year should talk to Pete right away.


Annual Dinner Was Tops!



District Directory Now Online

The 2003 Illinois District Directory is now available through the Internet. It is located on the Illinois District Web site (www.harmonize. ws/ill), in a manner of speaking. According to Webmaster **Daniel Garcia**, the Web site *is* the directory.

To explain: all the contents of what was formerly the printed version of the district directory are located on the district Web site. They're just not necessarily located in one place.

On the district home page, there is a menu down the left side; click on "Information" in that menu, and a pop-up menu will appear containing the following items:

- Chapters
- Quartets
- District Officers
- Committees
- Judges
- Past Presidents

These items replace corresponding sections of the oldformat directory. Past district champion quartets are listed under QCA; dates for conventions are shown in the IMPORTANT: In order to safeguard chapter officers' privacy, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses are NOT shown for public access. This information, however, is readily available to all members of SPEBSQSA.

The only way to access this information is to log in BE-FORE using the directory by entering your member number and your password. This is the same procedure used to access the Members Section of the SPEBSQSA Web site.

Therefore, if you do not have a password, you will need to obtain one via either the Society's Web site (www.spebsqsa.org) or the toll-free phone number for Harmony Hall (800/876-SING).

We will try to print out a limited number of hard copies of the directory for our technologically challenged members. The rest of you can get them at your convenience. Because the district database is linked to the Society's database, the information is constantly kept current.
