Northbrook Wins Triple Crown at Fall Convention

It was a clean sweep for Northbrook Chapter in Peoria Sept. 24 and 25.

New Tradition Chorus re-
prised their **Stephen Foster**
contest set from International
in Louisville to win their 15th
Illinois District championship,
followed by **Brotherhood of
Harmony Chorus** (Lake
County), **Sound of Illinois
Chorus** (Bloomington #1),
West Towns Chorus (Chi-
cagoland West Suburban),
and **Second City Chorus**
(Rockford Metro). In all, 14
choruses competed this time.

Meanwhile, **Lakeside Edition**,
representing Northbrook and
Frank Thorne Chapters,
bested 23 other quartets to
win district gold in their first
contest. Second to fifth place
were **Skyline**, **tsunami**, **Savoir
Four**, and **Talismen**. In addi-
tion, **Talismen** (Lake County,
Northbrook, and Frank Thorne
Chapters) won the right to
represent Illinois District in the
international senior quartet
contest at Midwinter Conven-
tion in Jacksonville.

While no earth-shattering decisions emerged from the meeting, several points were endorsed by consensus and, in addition to the questionnaires we received from chapter members, will form the basis of the Nov. 9 music team meeting:

- Attendees generally agreed that it would be better for our **Shoreliner Chorus** to forgo contest this coming spring and instead focus on building up our numbers.
- Members acknowledged a need for our music team to impose quality controls on our performing chorus, to the extent that a system of qualifying chorus participants might be desirable.
- Members agreed that it is important to include organized quartet activities along with chorus rehearsal as part of each chapter meeting.

Once the music team forges a recommended plan for the chapter's music program and recommends it to the Board, the Board will then develop an entire master plan and present it to the members for ratification. This is likely to happen some time in November. At that point, with a new sense of direction and purpose, we hope we will be able to proceed with our director search.

Six Things Every Director Wishes You Already Knew About Rehearsing

1. For the chorus to improve, each man must leave his own behavioral comfort zone. Improve one aspect, skill, or attitude each and every time you sing.
2. Become emotionally involved in the music. The music does not need to be complex to produce complex emotions. Anything less than full effort will result in a less satisfying musical experience for you and your audience.
3. Listen and extinguish comments while on the risers and during rehearsals.
4. Singing well takes a lot of exertion. Singing requires more concentration for a longer period of time than any other activity. Focus on the job at hand.
5. Skills take time to learn and more time to re-learn. The instruction is simple: sing all the word sounds in proper balance, with proper tone, with perfect unity, while expressing them in a heartfelt manner.
6. Have fun! Like each other and share in the joys of making great music because you don't know when you won't be able to do so again.

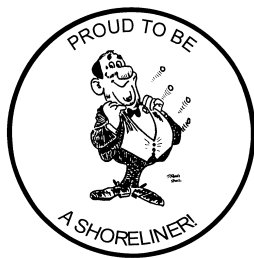
