HAPPY HOLIDAZE!

We're not referring to the Jewish High Holidays, of which we are in the midst. We're referring to the joyous and hectic Christmas/ Hanukkah/ New Year's season.

Why? Because on Sept. 22, we will begin working on our holiday music and assembling this year's holiday chorus. Time to start getting in the spirit!

Change Is in the Air!

You won't see "Under Construction" signs or hardhats at our meetings, but North Shore Chapter is being rebuilt from the ground up.

At this point in our development, especially now that **Dick Yanow** has stepped down after 14 years as our musical director, it's important that we reassess our chapter's goals and operating procedures, to ensure that we are truly meeting our members' needs.

This is a tremendous opportunity for our chapter to make a brand-new start and, quite honestly, it's also a scary prospect—but we must take this very necessary step if our chapter is to have a future.

Contradictions Need to Be Addressed

Recent events have underscored the need to resolve contradictions that hamper our functioning effectively. For example, our Mission Statement and Vision Statement (see page 2) both include public performances as chapter activities. However, we have had to cancel a recent planned chorus performance due to low member commitment and insufficient preparation. In addition, some of our performances earlier this year were not up to our usual standards.

We need to understand that if we wish to continue to be a chorus that performs in public, as stated, we must each make a commitment to learn the notes, words, and choreography for each song in our repertoire and be able to demonstrate, individually and as a group, that we can perform each song at an acceptable level of artistry.

If, instead, we choose to become a social club whose members get together weekly to sing informally, then perhaps we should abandon the idea of being a performing chorus. Or we might decide to adopt a completely new and different chapter structure.

In any event, the question of what type of chapter North Shore is to be must be answered before we can approach any candidates to fill the director's position. For that matter, the question must be answered before we even proceed with considering implementing the Society's Music Man program, which we have been chosen to pilot.

Special Meeting Called

For that reason, a special meeting for the good of the chapter has been called for **Wednesday night, Sept. 29**. It will be at our usual meeting place, Elliott Hall, and will begin at the usual meeting time. All North Shore Chapter members are encouraged to attend.

At the meeting, members will be asked what activities they would like to see occur at chapter meetings and, more importantly, what kind of chapter they want North Shore to be. A number of alternative formats that have been used by other chapters may be presented—with the understanding, of course, that North Shore has a unique identity and that we will ultimately need to develop a structure that is uniquely suited to North Shore Chapter.

Following the meeting, the music team and then the Board will incorporate member input into developing a chapter plan that will be voted on by members at an upcoming meeting. The new plan may retain or alter our current Mission and Vision Statements.

Directions to the Oct. 4 Bash

If traveling south on I-94 (Edens Expwy.), continue south onto the Kennedy Expwy. At the Chicago Circle interchange, exit to I-290 (Eisenhower Expy.) westbound; continue to I-88 (East-West Tollway) westbound.

If traveling south on I-294 (Tri-State Tollway), continue south and exit onto westbound I-88 (East-West Tollway).

Then . . . continue approximately 5.7 miles on I-88. Exit at Highland Ave. (southbound) in Downers Grove—use ramp toward Midwestern College/Keller College. Turn left onto Highland and follow it until it becomes Main St.—should be a total of about 2.6 miles. Turn left onto Warren Ave. (just before the Metra tracks). There should be on-street parking, or park in the adjacent lot.
